1. Limited Editions Club, Inc., (No Fee)—Class A. "The Dolphin No. 4, Part 1, Fall, 1940." Material which was previously published in the format of a book and registered as an "A" now appears with a new format and is identified by the publisher on the front cover as a periodical and on the title-page as a magazine. Published three times a year. Examiner feels that in view of the fact that it is only published three times a year and that previous registrations were made as "book", that that classification should be continued. The Revisory Board is unanimous in the opinion that the proper classification is "B", so that the work now identified for the public as a periodical will be properly indexed in Part 2 of the Catalogue of Copyright Entries where it belongs.
 2. Concordia Publishing House (63009)—Class E. "Tidings Angelic." E-1 application was filed with a copyright claim covering new matter consisting of compilation and arrangement. The Examiner suggests that application Form E would be more proper, and further that compilation is not new musical composition. The Revisory Board sustains the Examiner in requesting a Form E application and also approves the letter prepared by RSM (10-3-40) requesting such application but making no statement to the effect that compilation is not new musical composition as it was felt that such was not necessary in requesting the E application, it being suggested to point out that the work being a new collection now published for the first time, Form E would be required.
